Imaging Requisition

MRI Brain without contrast (standard protocol with T1, T2, FLAIR, DWI sequences): Evaluate for structural lesion, white matter changes, or vascular abnormality in the setting of new-onset migraine with aura and recent significant increase in headache frequency. Specific attention to posterior fossa, circle of Willis, and cortical venous structures. Rule out mass lesion, AVM, Chiari malformation, or demyelinating disease.

28-year-old female with 3-week history of escalating migraine with classic visual aura. Headache frequency increased from 1-2 per month to 3-4 per week. Right-sided throbbing pain 8/10, episodes lasting 4-12 hours. Associated nausea, photophobia, phonophobia. No focal neurological deficits on history. No history of head trauma. OTC analgesics ineffective. First-time imaging for this presentation.
